

Science

The human skeleton was our focus this week in science. The children learnt the different bones of the human skeleton and loved labelling their own moving parts skeleton! Ask your child if they can sing the 'bones song'?

English

In English this week the children have thoroughly enjoyed describing their very own monsters. We have focused on using exciting adjectives, adverbs, alliteration and similes to add detail. We enjoyed learning about Theseus and the Minotaur through our 'visit' to Greece where we also learned about archaeology and how the Ancient Greeks recorded stories on pottery.

Maths

We have continued to work on fractions this week in maths. The children have used the 'Bar Model' as a method to work out fractions of a given number with some moving on to improper fractions. Remember to continue to learn your times tables as this will really help with our work on fractions.
