Measure

In maths this week, Year 4 have been having a great time learning about capacity, weight/mass, height and distance. Pupils had fun estimating the capacity of a variety of containers and converting from millilitres to litres. In the length session, children were using mm, cm and m to estimate and accurately measure a variety of objects. During the mass/weight session, children have been learning to estimate and use scales to measure. Pupils were given a 100g weight to hold and compare with a range of different food items. Why not ask your child to estimate the weight/length of household objects or the capacity of the bath and a cup of tea!
