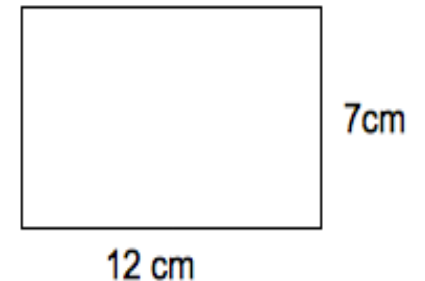
**PLEA!** Please can you keep sending in any spare cardboard boxes that you have (especially cereal boxes) for our D.T. project! Thank you.
