English

This week we have continued to write our adventure stories. The children have worked really hard to make their writing interesting and exciting. It is clear to see that they have become confident writers and are using some great vocabulary. Our SPaG focus this week was fronted adverbials. Which the children have been challenged to use in their writing. A fronted adverbial is a word phrase or clause that is placed at the start of a sentence. They are used to explain the place, time, manner, possibility and frequency of which something happens. It is separated from the main clause with a comma.

Maths

The children have consolidated their learning of multiplication and division. They have shown that they can use the grid and expanded methods for multiplication and the bus stop method for division. They have then applied these skills to word problems.

Homework

This week we would like your child to complete the fronted adverbials activity. You will find this inside their homework books. It should be returned to school by no later than Wednesday 28th June.
