Maths

This week in maths the children have been focusing on time. They have been learning to convert between a 24 hour digital clock and an analogue clock, and solving time related word problems. They have also been converting between units of time, for example seconds to minutes and minutes to hours.

English

This week we reflected on how people living in Germany were affected by WW2. We read the story of Otto, a German teddy bear, and Rose Blanch, the story of a little girl. Both books provided a great starting point for discussion about the rights and wrongs of war. The children discussed their ideas and asked thought provoking questions.

Science

The children had great fun in science investigating and experimenting with simple circuits. They worked in small groups to predict and test whether certain circuits would work and investigated different materials to find out which ones were the best at conducting electricity and which ones were the best at insulating against electricity.
