



Just to let you know...

In English and topic this week the children have looked at the features of Tudor houses (both rich and poor) and what was special about them. We had a visit from Nick who is an estate agent at Burns and Webber and he explained how houses are sold. The children then studied the language and structure of estate agents' brochures, and looked at the methods they employ to sell houses effectively. They used what they had learnt to become Tudor estate agents and have started to design their own brochure to sell a property which they designed themselves.



In maths this week, we worked on different methods of division and went on to have fun with word problems. Ask your child which method they preferred.

We will be having a DT day on Wednesday 21st November, where the children will be designing and making their own Tudor houses. It would be helpful to have a look at www.mymaths.co.uk the username is Pewley and the password is squared. Click on 'Level 4' and select '2D and 3D shape', followed by 'nets of 3D shapes' there is an online lesson and a homework which will be useful for when the children come to design their Tudor house.
