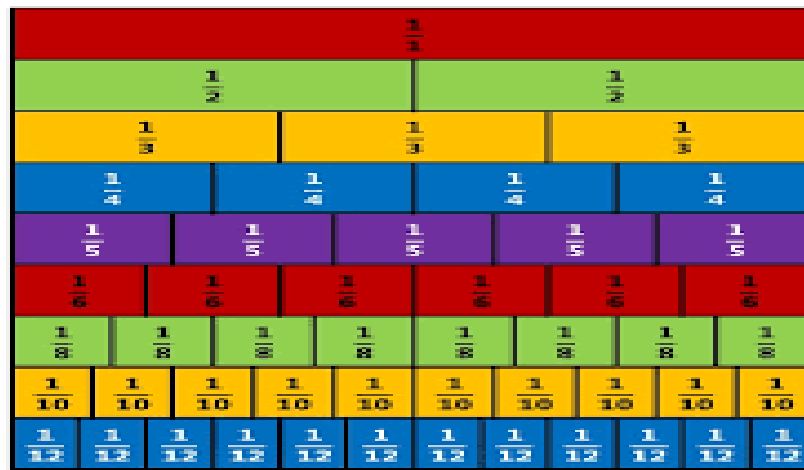
### Adaptation project
