After our fantastic day out at Wisley the children are now experts on plant adaptation. We have also begun to research information about the Amazon River.



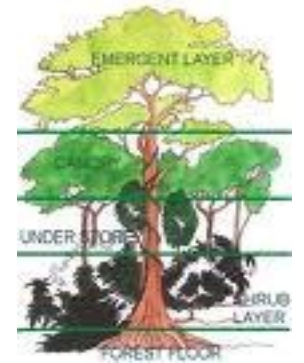
