This Week we have been exploring Where the Wild Things Are by Maurice Sendak.

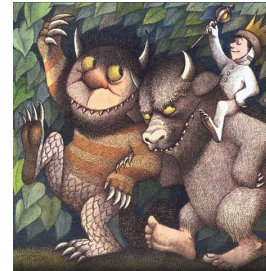
