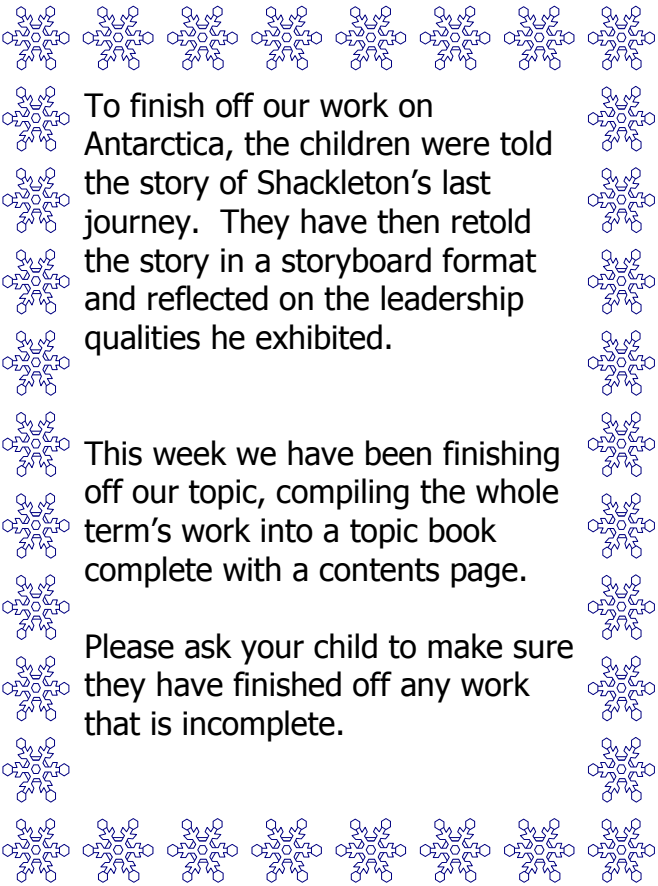


Just to let you know...

Please ask your child to make sure they have finished off any work that is incomplete.

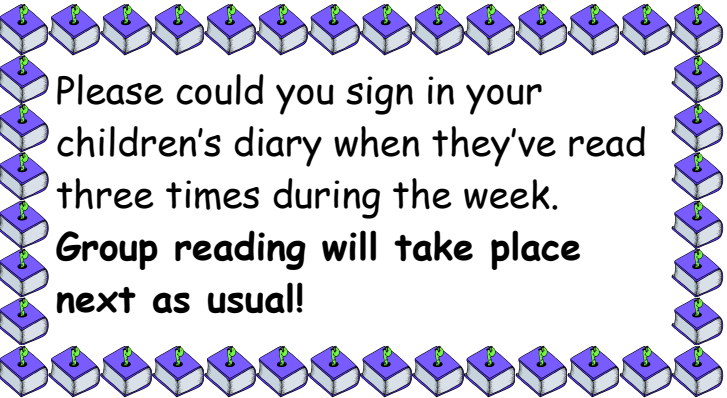


Library books changed on Wednesdays. 6M next week
