










Words and phrases we use at Holy Trinity Pewley Down School (HTPD)

<p>Mufti day - children can come in to school wearing their own home clothes.</p>	
<p>Dressing-up day - a day when children dress up as a particular character, e.g., a fairy story character, an arctic explorer.</p>	
<p>JTLYK (Just To Let You Know) - a weekly information sheet that lets you know what your child is learning, and provides details of any trips or special activities. This is uploaded to Tapestry and the school website on Fridays.</p>	
<p>Wild Place - outdoor learning area, which children from Pewley visit once a week. They need coats and wellies for this.</p>	
<p>FOPS / HTSC - Friends of Pewley School and Holy Trinity School Community - parents who organise social events and fund-raising events. Open to all parents. They are always looking for helpers and new ideas!</p>	
<p>FLUFFY Friday - Facilitating Learning on Fridays - a special day once a term when the children do lots of different activities in different groups. Children will wear their home clothes. This happens three times a year, on the Friday before the October, February and May half term holidays.</p>	
<p>Parent consultations - an opportunity for you to come in to school and have a chat with your child's teacher to find out about progress.</p>	
<p>Phonics - the structured system by which the sounds are learnt in the early stages of learning to read.</p>	
<p>Reading practice books - the books which your child brings home once a week, so that you can listen to them read regularly from a book that is at the appropriate level for them. They will have already read this book a few times in school.</p>	
<p>Sharing book - your child visits the school library once a week and will bring home a book to share at home with you.</p>	
<p>PUPS - paid childcare after school, available until 6 pm at Pewley CLUBS+ - paid childcare after school, available until 6 pm at Holy Trinity</p>	

<p>After-school clubs – clubs such as art, football, Lego etc. These clubs are mainly run by a teacher after school. Booking forms are sent home termly.</p> <p>There are also some paid for after school clubs led by outside organisations, such as, Boogie Pumps, football, and ballet.</p>	
<p>Breakfast Club – paid childcare before school, available from 8am.</p>	
<p>Mr Proud – a purple Mr Men character, referred to when children's work or behaviour is something they can feel proud for.</p>	
<p>Little Miss Grow – a green Little Miss character, referred to when there is some aspect of work or behaviour that the children can improve upon.</p>	
<p>Tapestry – this is our online learning journey that we have for each child at Pewley. Parents are able to access this to see what the children have been up to recently, as well as posting their own observations.</p>	
<p>Parent Mail and Parent Pay – these two systems are used by school. <u>Parent Mail</u> is used to send you messages and reminders, which will arrive to your email. <u>Parent Pay</u>, which allows you to pay money to the school for school trips and cooking contributions etc.</p>	
<p>INSET Day – this is a day where school is closed to children because teachers are having a training day.</p>	
<p>Zones of Regulation - The Zones of Regulation is a curriculum based around the use of four colours to help children first identify how their body is feeling, before categorising these feelings into either the Green, Yellow, Red or Blue Zone.
