Maths

This week, we rounded off our maths topic on measurement by completing our work on capacity and volume. We explored equivalent measurements, compared different capacities and volumes, and practised adding and subtracting litres and millilitres.

We had lots of fun applying our mathematical skills to real-world situations by measuring containers filled with different coloured water. The children learned how important it is to ensure the liquid is still and that their eyes are level with the scale in order to take an accurate reading.

Ask your child to have a go at the question.

Number Sense

Number Sense is a new programme we are running across the school to support children with their times tables and related division facts. In Year 3, the children are currently focusing on the 2 times tables and are beginning to apply this knowledge to division facts as well. We spend 10 minutes each day practising Number Sense. After marking, children receive a score out of 40 questions. Please don't worry if your child is not scoring 40 out of 40 at this stage — this is completely normal.



The aim of the programme is that short, daily practice will gradually improve children's confidence, memory, and understanding of times tables as we move through the scheme. Progress will come with time and continued practice.



Flat Evacuees
