We hope you all had a lovely week!

In maths this week, we continued our unit on fractions. We have understood the difference between unit and non – unit fractions. The children learnt that unit fractions have 1 as a numerator. We have also worked on finding out that  $1/2$  is equal to  $2/4$ .

We are also beginning a focus on Maths fluency, this will involve practicing simple bonds and timetable facts to help the children recall them very quickly in preparation for year 3.

In English, we have begun a new unit on writing letters. We are writing letters to children in Hong Kong to find out about them and their school and how it is similar and different to ours. This week we have planned, edited and published our letters. The children worked very hard to publish them and focused really well on their presentation.

**Geography**

In Geography this week we spent time looking at the UK. Its counties, capital cities and surrounding oceans and seas. We also looked at compass points and worked out where the UK counties are in relation to each other.
