#### **Evacuee Day – Friday 12<sup>th</sup> June**

On Friday 12<sup>th</sup> June, we will take the children into Guildford to experience what life would have been like as an evacuee arriving in Guildford during WW2. We will take a walking tour through parts of the town where the children will meet different 'locals' from the period.

The children will need to be dressed as an evacuee with appropriate footwear for walking. We will be outside for the majority of the day, so please make sure their costume is weather appropriate, for example including a hat if it is sunny (along with sunscreen), and coat if it is raining or cold. They will need to bring a healthy snack, packed lunch (no nuts) and a refillable water bottle with them. Please drop children off to their class teacher at **Home Farm Gate, Stoke Park** (just off Nightingale Road) at **9.30 am**. Please arrive at the **school hall - 'Billeting Station'** - where you will be reunited with your evacuated child upon their return at **2:45pm**. Collection in role as an 'evacuee host parent' is particularly welcome at this time.
