Maths

This week, we consolidated our work on time, in particular knowing that there are 60 seconds in a minute and 60 minutes in an hour. We then began to look at shape, focusing on perpendicular, parallel, vertical and horizontal lines. The children also learnt about right angles and that the corners of a square always meet at 90 degrees. They drew polygons in their books and grouped these into triangles and quadrilaterals. They also answered questions about the types of 2D shapes, justifying their answers using the correct mathematical vocabulary.

English

This week, the children finished their war poems, making sure to edit them and then publish them in their best handwriting. Some children performed their poems to their class, using their best reading voices and making sure to use good prosody. They focused on volume, pace, expression and eye contact. This was a chance for them to show off what they had learnt in reading sessions across the year.

Science

The children were very excited to spend some time learning about electricity this week. We looked at what electricity is, the source of energy that electricity comes from, and how electricity moves through a series circuit. We talked about the National Grid being a huge version of a circuit and the way that our homes and school get electricity from mains power. The children worked out how to make a working series circuit in order to make a lightbulb light up.
